What Do I Put Into the Greenwaste Cart?

In 1995, the recycling of polyethylene terephthalate (PET) bottles reached a new high. Thirty four percent of all the bottles produced were being recycled. These bottles are turned into everything from rugs to goggles, park benches and fences to fiber for filling ski jackets.

Steel and aluminum cans can be easily recycled for use in other steel and aluminum products. This not only conserves mineral resources, but the recycling process also uses about 75% less energy than using virgin materials. Recycled steel and aluminum finds its way into new cars, bikes, appliances, cookware, and a whole lot more.

So remember: almost everything can be recycled except the planet.

Use cloth napkins in team colors and reusable plastic and ceramic plates to add fun to your meal as you cheer for your favorite team.

Commit to purchasing longer lasting products such as compact florescent light bulbs and rechargeable batteries. You will save money, conserve energy and make less trash.

Plop, Plop, Fizz, Fizz - Oh How Clean It Is!
