of paper mail you no longer wish to receive.

Catalog Choice sends merchants your catalog optout request on your behalf, but please note that we have no control over how and when merchants will process your opt-out request. We're constantly trying to work with merchants to encourage them to comply with your opt-out requests.

Garbage Carts Please place your cart at the curb edge with at least 3 feet of clearance from other objects, including other carts, basketball hoops and motor vehicles. Make sure your cart lid is down completely. Thank you for helping us provide you with the best possible service. Together we can keep our neighborhoods safe and clean.

Please — no dirt, rocks, batteries, fluorescent lights, sharps or overloading — lids must be closed to prevent spills.

Recycling Cart Acceptable List Paper, cardboard, aluminum containers and foil, steel or tin cans, glass bottles and jars, plastic bottles and tubs (such as yogurt, margarine and cottage cheese, numbers **1** through **2**).

Recycling Cart Non-Acceptable List No plastic bags, wrapping film, wire and string, waxed paper containers, foam packaging, paper towels & napkins, food soiled paper & cardboard, aerosol cans and diapers.

Greenwaste Cart Acceptable List Grass and weed clippings, shrubs and tree prunings (less than 4" in diameter), leaves, plants and flowers, food scraps and food soiled paper products.

Greenwaste Cart Non-Acceptable List No plastic bags, wrapping film, no household garbage. No dirt or rocks. No overloading — lid must be closed to prevent spills.

Household Hazardous Waste Service Change

As of March 25, 2019 Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) facilities can no longer accept *Prescription* **Medication** at the Oakland, Livermore, and Hayward drop-off facilities. Prescription Medication is accepted at over 70 drug stores, hospitals, and law enforcement sites throughout the county, for more information visit www.stopwaste.org.

Medicine and Prescription Medications

Disposal Options:

Medicines should never be flushed down the toilet or placed in the trash.

- Dispose of your unneeded drugs at local pharmacies, hospitals, and law enforcement sites, see the list below for details. Recycle ?
- Go to stopwaste.org and search Recycle Where? for other locations.

Special Instructions:

- Pills should be poured out into Ziploc bags (it protects your privacy and lowers disposal costs). All of your pills may be mixed together in one bag.
- Needles and other sharps must be packaged in approved sharps containers made with puncture and leak-resistant plastic.



What would you like to get rid of?


Liquids and creams: leave in their original container and secure caps/lids. Black out any personally identifying information and place in a Ziploc bag.

Controlled Substances:

Prescription controlled substances are drugs that have a high potential for abuse and may lead to physical or psychological dependence. Due to legal restrictions the Alameda County HHW facilities and many other drop off locations CANNOT ACCEPT CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES. Check the table below for locations that accept controlled substances.

Controlled Substances Include:

- Narcotic pain medications such as Vicodin, Oxycontin, and Codeine.
- Sleeping pills such as Valium, Lunesta, and Ambien
- ADD/ADHS drugs such as Concerta, and Adderall.
- Antidepressants such as Zoloft.
- Cough syrups with Codeine.
